GPGS Curriculum

Great Parent Great Start uses a research-based curriculum that supports families in strengthening protective factors and increasing the health, safety, and learning readiness of young children. "Parents as Teachers" is the home visiting model we use to increase parent knowledge of early child development, improve parenting practices, provide early detection of developmental delays and health issues, prevent child abuse and neglect, and increase school readiness.

"Parents as Teachers" involves the training and certification of parent educators who share information and use evidence-based practices by partnering, facilitating, and reflecting with families. Services emphasize parent-child interaction, development-centered parenting, and family well-being.

"Parents as Teachers" is a recognized curriculum for the Federal Early Childhood Home Visiting Initiative. It is currently used in over 2000 programs nation wide and in more than 100 Native American Tribal settings. Other countries using "Parents as Teachers" include: Australia, Canada, England, Germany, Mexico, New Zealand, Scotland, Switzerland, and Wales.
